Laundry seems to be something that never stops. Even as you are doing your laundry, you are wearing clothes that will be in the laundry tonight! It is not something you can stop learning about either. When I was a child my grandmother had a wringer washer and two wash tubs on the porch. She used the same laundry soap in every load. Clothes were wrung out as dry as possible by cranking that wringer – first to get out the wash water, and then to get out the rinse water. As time has gone by washers have improved. We

must learn new things – which cycle is best for which clothes. We must decide whether to add extra softeners or special spot removers. Some washers use a very limited amount of water, some have no agitators at all. Just because I knew how to do the laundry as a child, doesn't mean I will know how to do it when I go to visit my children. Their washers have complicated buttons and dials, and require special soaps used only in limited amounts.

Studying the Bible is kind of like doing the laundry. It is something we need to do all the time to become better Christians. When we were children, we were taught basic tenants from the Bible. As it says in Corinthians 13: 11 *"When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things."*

As we mature in our faith we are called to dig deeper into God's word. I asked someone recently what their favorite Bible verse is, and he told me "The one I read today." I think that is something I should remember too. Just like doing the laundry is an almost daily occurrence, reading and studying my Bible should be something I do every day. Every day things are changing and we need to adapt to those changes. God's word is full of help for all of us as we meet the challenges of the day. My problems are no longer the ones I had as a child. In order to be the best Christian I can be, I need to read and understand the Bible.

Something that has helped me are the weekly Bible studies we are now having at our church. I am not the best student. I struggle with some of the big words, and I struggle even more with some of the big ideas that the Bible contains. But Don is a great teacher and is very patient with all of us. If you have time on Tuesdays, please join us!



Bible Study


