James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." And he said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?" And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory."

Mark 10: 35 - 37, NRSV

As we have entered the season of Lent, it is the time of introspection and contemplation. It is the season where we often give up things, chocolate, caffeine, etc., to show our devotion to and joining Christ on his journey to Jerusalem. As has been pointed out by so many, often times the act of giving something up is often more of a public performance to show how pious one is, or how difficult this journey truly is as they cannot have their Coke or Hershey's Kiss. In a 2018 homily, Pope Francis says of fasting, of giving something up:

Do not give into the temptation of 'showing off' by fasting: "by making a fuss of it and letting people know that we are practicing Catholics and we do penance, so that people think 'what a good person'. This is a trick. It's pretending to be virtuous". "We must pretend, but with a smile. That is not showing others that we are performing acts of penance." (Vatican News, February 16, 2018)

Pope Francis then went on to say, "When fasting, a true Christian must be consistent, not putting himself on show, never despising others or engaging in quarrels or disagreements." He then invited those present to ask themselves how they are interacting with others. He then shared what has been shared across the internet:

"(T)he fasting that is acceptable to the Lord aims to "release those bound unjustly, untying the thongs of the yoke; setting free the oppressed, breaking every yoke".

As I was reading Mark 10, it struck me what a challenging chapter it is. The Pharisees were trying to trap Jesus with a question about marriage. When parents were bringing their children to be blessed by Jesus, the disciples were rudely turning them away. There is the story of the rich young man and Jesus' third warning to his disciples of what was to happen in Jerusalem. All of this leading up to James and John coming to Jesus to ask for the seats of honor when his kingdom comes in its glory.

This scene has always stood out to me. With everything they had seen, everything they had been taught, with everything that they had experienced in just this short period of time in chapter 10, James and John had the temerity to ask for the seats of honor. And I don't know if it is better or worse in the Gospel of Matthew that it is James and John's mother who makes the request. All I know is that the other disciples are indignant that the brothers would ask such a thing. Especially since each of the other disciples were hoping for the same honor.

Which brings me back to the words of Pope Francis. Though we tend to focus on James and John, all of the disciples were looking for glory and honor for themselves. They were not asking themselves how they were interacting with others. Instead, they wanted the focus to be on them rather than to be on the God they served, and the Christ they followed.

As we go through this Lenten season, may our focus not be on ourselves but on the God who through His Son, granted us the gift of life, and through the gift of the Holy Spirit, keeps alive in our hearts, our minds, our bodies, and our souls the knowledge and surety that the love of our God will never leave us, but will go with us all the days of our lives. And as we walk in the light of God's love, may our sacrifices truly be pleasing to our God: our giving of ourselves to lift up our neighbor so that all will know the joy we find in the love of God revealed to us through Christ Jesus.

I look forward to worshipping with you, both online and in person, during this season of Lent. And as we go through this time of introspection and prayer, may you always feel the presence of Christ's peace and love. So, until next we meet, PEACE!






