As I have shared numerous times over the past six years, one of the most challenging parts of my ministry is often knowing what to say in my pastor's column. And now, with this being my last column as your pastor, the task is even more daunting.

I have been blessed to be your pastor for the past six years. In those six years there have been seasons of blessings and seasons of hardships that we worked to overcome together, including the past year dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic. And through it all there has been one constant, the love of God as revealed in Christ Jesus and empowered by the Holy Spirit.

It is in the spirit of that love you welcomed my family, unloading our furniture not just once, but twice when we were not able to close on our house on the date we were supposed to. You embraced our daughter, making her feel welcome in a new community where she was not sure if and how she would fit in. When our son Derrick came to live with us, like Sara, you made him feel welcome. And for this I am grateful and I say thank you.

Over these last weeks together I, along with the leadership of the congregation, will be preparing for my departure and planning for the arrival of the interim minister, and further in the future a new settled pastor. This will be a time of farewells while also looking toward the future. There will be questions asked, some that can be answered and some that will have to wait for an answer, a time of fear, wondering what is the future of First Christian Church of Goodland, and a time of hope as people envision what the future can be for First Christian Church.

As I leave you, I leave you as your pastor, but not as your friend. According to my ministerial code of ethics, when I leave after my last Sunday, my duty is to support and encourage the ministry of my successor. That means that I will not come back to perform weddings, officiate at funerals, or participate in events that would infringe upon the ministry of my successor. If in working with your new interim and later with your new settled minister and they are comfortable in inviting me, or any previous minister, to be a part of a particular service, then I would consider returning to assist with a service. When it comes to social media, for a period of six months I will not unfriend anyone but I will unfollow people. That just means your social media posts will not show up on my social media newsfeed. And as it shares in the "Covenant of Closure," I will separate myself from participating in the life of the congregation for a year after the arrival of the new settled pastor.

As I prepare to leave you, I have to admit there is sense of excitement as I prepare for my new calling as an interim minister. But I have to also admit there is sense of sadness as well. It is always hard to say good-bye to people who have been such an important part of my life for the past six years. You shared your love, your hurts, your hopes, and your dreams with me. You let me be a part of your lives and your families. You have blessed me and my family and for that I again say thank you. My hope and prayer is that I have been able to share with you the love, grace, mercy, and forgiveness of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

So, as I have shared with you over the past year, whether we are together or apart, we are one in Christ. And, for one last time in this newsletter, until next we meet, PEACE!






