We Are At War

Everything is a battle. We live at war, but we will not be overcome as we are in Christ. The world sees it but not in its fullness. Turn on the news and everyone is at war with everyone else. We live in a time of peace in certain respects and yet there is hostility. We may not be facing a world war and guns may not be taking lives around us but the devil is still at work in many ways.

As Christians we expect all of this hostility and chaos around us even as we face a bigger battle. We're told that there will be wars and rumors of wars and yet our battle isn't ultimately against flesh and blood. Paul encourages us to be strong in the Lord's might. God gives us armor against every plan of the devil. Our ultimate battle isn't ultimately against the people around us, but against the devil and his power. We have no hope to fight in that battle apart from the armor graciously given to us by God. Christ defeated the devil and gives us armor as we move toward the last day.

You are in a battle and it's easy to get war-torn. You need God's armor. You need God's nourishment. You need healing that only comes from Christ. Christ brought you into His kingdom with what you need to survive and thrive in Christ. That's the last thing that the devil wants you to remember. He wants you to think that the right chemo will take care of the cancer and then everything will be fine. He wants you to think that the right job will fix the money problem and then the world will spin rightly again. The world wants you to believe that if you're organized and disciplined enough you have nothing to worry about.


God has something different to say. God tells you that He made you His own and His grace is sufficient in your weakness. He reminds you over and over again that this is a dark world, but that He sent His Son to be the light of the world. His Son overcame darkness for you. The devil may try to trick and deceive and entice, but Christ comes with the truth that this world will fail you. Christ will not fail you. The best medicine will not prevent eternal death. The most money will not keep the car from finally rusting apart. The discipline and self control and philosophies of the world will not ultimately save. Christ has.

Our comfort and strength is in Christ who defeated death for us and now sends us boldly out into the world equipped for the spiritual war that we cannot see but can constantly perceive as we hear about death and violence going on around us. You get to go out living in this peace and sharing that peace with others. We see that this armor is all rooted in God's work for us through Christ and that we continue to need to be clothed in this armor more than anything else. We need to hear God's Word. We need to be connected to Jesus in His sacrament. We need to pray. This is what God gives to us and so we use these gifts by the power of the Holy Spirit.

We don't want to be the people who live as though a connection to Christ is optional or that going to church is what it means to be a Christians rather than living with all things submitted to Christ. That will get us killed on the battle-field. There is always a battle for you and you only make it through forever through your connection to Christ by faith. Christ washed you and made you His own in His kingdom which cannot be overcome.

Even as our bodies fail us and the promises of the world crash and burn, Christ continues to be with you in the battle. That will not change.



In May, it will be our turn to deliver the Meals on Wheels food to those who need help with getting healthy




Before they were gifted, we prayed for those who would be receiving them and the caring staff that would give them!

Nifty Needlers


Meeting every Tuesday @ 2 p.m. in the Church's Sewing Room (north west corner of the building).
