Faith in God's facts makes them real in your experience. Hebrews 10:1—Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.

This writing was inspired by a portion of a book which was written by a former instructor of mine – Philip St. Romain. The book is "Growing in Inner Freedom: A Guide for Today", and the segment was entitled *Live by Faith*, *Not Feelings*. I will be sure to give credit to him for the portions I use.

FAITH vs FEELINGS

HALT is an acronym for some of the times in which we should not trust our feelings — when we are Hungry, Angry (anxious), Lonely, or Tired. These can be times in which what we feel is either skewed or magnified out of proportion. On the other hand, sometimes our feelings can be very helpful and we should pay close attention to them. This comes into play in situations of looming danger or just knowing something is or isn't right. Feelings can be necessary tools or they can get in the way of right thinking.

The Spirit of God does stir and use our feelings or emotions. After all, they were made and given to us by our Creator as useful. These are often thought of to be found wrapped in joy and love when we have blissful mountain top experiences. But what do we do with the feelings we have in the valley times? Do we embrace those feelings as readily and consider them useful as well? We can actually 'love' the 'good' feelings enough to seek them above seeking God without realizing it.

As for faith, Philip St. Romain suggests that everyone has faith in one form or another. When we go to a restaurant, we have faith that those who prepare our food won't poison us, or that fellow travelers will stay on their side of the road. He goes on to say that these kinds of faith are very much like trust.

Religious faith involves trust as well, but is much deeper than that. St. Romain goes on to say that living by faith means we trust that God has ordained life as meaningful and "we live as though we are loved and desired by God, even when our life experiences seem to fly in the face of this conviction. No matter what anyone says, we hold fast to our conviction that nothing can separate us from the love of God (see Romans 8:35-39)."

He also says, "Faith as conviction and life-stance means that we do not always have to feel the confirmation of our beliefs. We should not evaluate our closeness to God in terms of feelings. God is as close to us when we are dry and cranky as when we are filled with charitable exuberance."

How do YOU let faith and feelings coexist? Is your faith swayed by feelings? Are your feelings swayed by faith? In this time of "high-emotion living", it is something to think about for sure. I am asking God to help me find/keep a healthy balance, how about you?


















March 16, 1947 - September 3, 2021

(excerpts from the writing of his life) Bob & Darla Brock moved to Goodland in 1973, and Bob eventually ended up working for Yellow Freight Trucking as a driver, then as a relay manager. He was recognized for driving 1.7 million miles acci-Robert William Brock dent-free. Bob was a member of the Masonic Lodge #321 and Northwest

Kansas Shriners. Bob enjoyed fishing and hunting and he was very good at both. In 1974, while bow hunting north of Goodland, Bob shot a non-typical mule deer that landed him in the record books. His deer scored 224 6/8 points, making him the Kansas Archery Mule Deer record holder, a title that he held for almost twenty years.

Later in life, Bob enjoyed metal detecting and drone flying. Because they ended up in Enfield, Conn., he found many artifacts from early American history.






