In Isaiah 55:11 we hear the Lord saying:

11 so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth;

it shall not return to me empty,

but it shall accomplish that which I purpose,

and prosper in the thing for which I sent it.

I will be more direct about this one and share that often times when I feel inspired to write, either for this segment or for something else, those are the very messages I end up needing later myself! That doesn't mean they were only for me, but also for me. These words when eaten (unlike the 'crow' mentioned above) are sweet and life-giving.

Thank you, God, for the messages You give us. Even as we think we are delivering an inspiration to others, You use it for our good as well. Your words & timing are always perfect!


